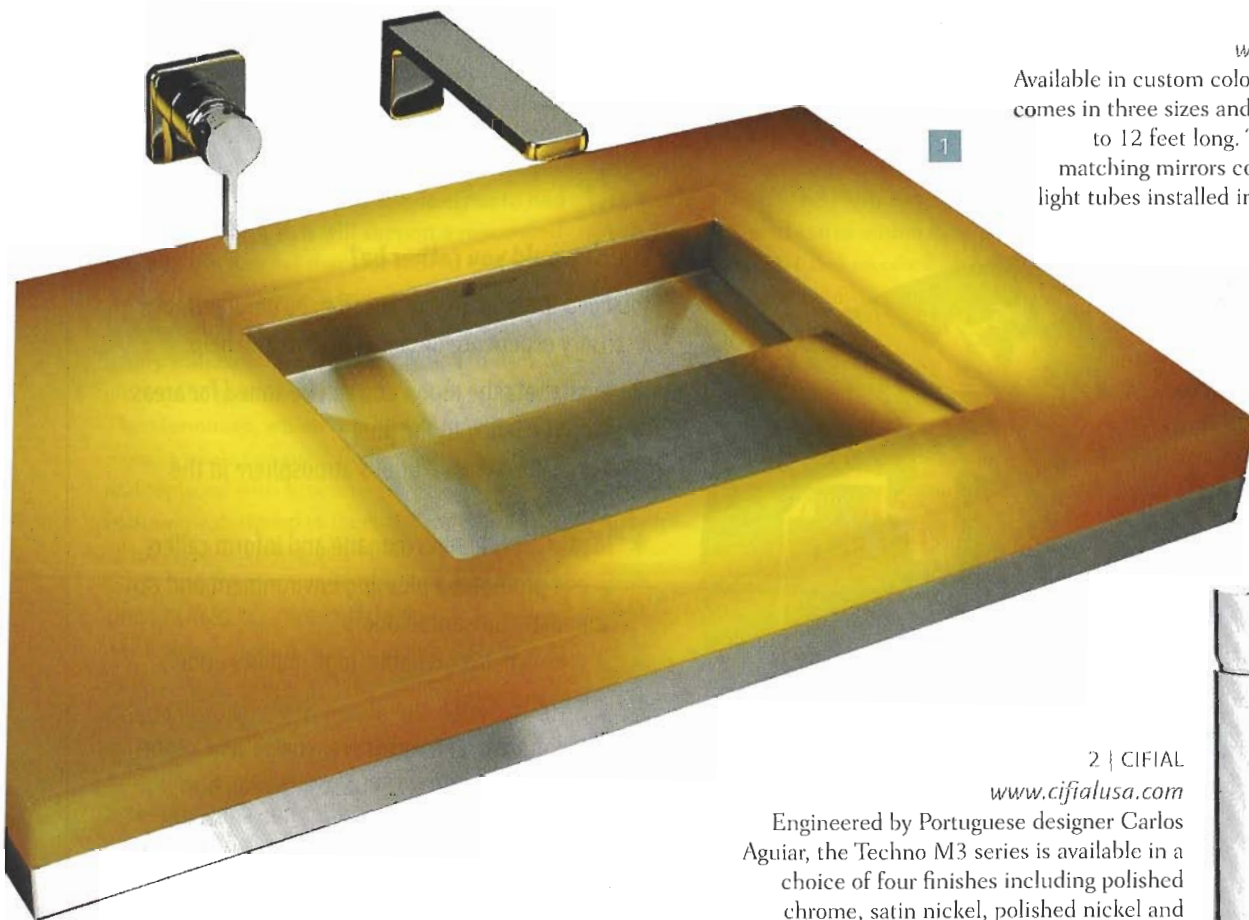




## Make a Splash

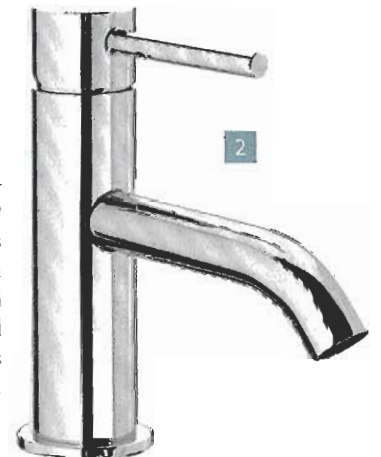
